Today, as part of our ongoing pastoral care programme, we launched the Prue Salter online study skills module for Years 11 and 12. The Year 12's have this very useful tool accessible to them throughout their HSC year to enhance their current study strategies.

Year 10 students participated in a sexual health and relationship workshop provided by Life Lessons Educational Programs.

Year 8 students participated in a workshop on language and labeling, while Year 9s had a session with the Butterfly Foundation, which dealt with self-image and body confidence.

Year 7 students spent the time with Mr. Garratt who expanded on their Orientation Programme outlining the expectations that the school has of them. This encompassed their role as members of a school and wider community and how our insistence on mutual respect plays out in each setting in which they might find themselves.

With that in mind, I would like to remind all students, and ask parents to insist that their children who travel on public transport wear face masks as directed by the NSW Health Guidelines. 
