Dear Parents & Caregivers,

It is unbelievable that this week we are heading into autumn and that our wettest summer in years due to La Nina has come to a close. Students are well and truly into their stride and the rhythm and predictability of the term are comforting.

All extracurricular activities, both sport and cultural are ensuring a very active school life for students involved and I report on a number of those today:

Many of our sports teams are entering the representative phase of the summer calendar where zone championships occur. Having left ISD at the end of last year and joined the CDSSA association of schools, Mr. Kable, together with our coaches and students, are getting a feel for a competition that is far more competitive than that to which we had previously been exposed. What a great learning curve for all as we strive to meet the challenge and adapt. This week saw the swimming championships held at Warringah Aquatic Centre on Monday (full results on page 4).

Next Wednesday the tennis players have their turn. The touch football competition was won by both our Junior and Senior boys teams with both Girl's teams losing on a drop off in the final and being awarded the silver medal.



Mr Cooper who takes the U12 Boy's Cricket Team reported that "On Sunday morning the Reddam Ravens took on Easts Fireballs in the penultimate game of the season. The conditions at Booralee suited runs on the board, so the Ravens decided to have a bat first after winning the toss. Abdullah Khurram saved one of his best batting performances of the year for the end of the season, with a blistering knock of 37* from 43 balls, that included 7 boundaries. He was well supported by Oscar Bakes (10 from 24) and Nathan Ross (13 from 32). It was good to see Aidan Fuzi dig in this week, spending some time in the middle for a score of 9. The Ravens finished the innings with a score of 4-102, of which they should feel proud as the collapse that has haunted them all season was prevented through good, smart, defensive batting. This week they will need to use defense as a form of attack and look to score more runs through quick singles and splitting the field. The opening bowling trio of Oscar Bakes, Abdullah Khurram, and Idan Olovitz all bowled beautifully in the early overs, keeping the run rate to a minimum and each snaring a wicket in the process. It was great to see plenty of maiden overs being bowled, indicating that they are understanding the fundamentals of line and length bowling. At drinks, the boys were looking good at 5/43 and they could taste a potential victory.



The Fireballs dug in after lunch, making things hard for the bowlers. As the match moved into the latter stages of the game it was clear that this one would go right through to the final overs and indeed it did. In the last over of the game, the Fireballs required a total of 4 runs to win. On the last ball of the game, the scores were tied, with a single required to win the game and take the biscuits. Bowled! Idan Olovitz knocks leg stump out of the ground to save the Ravens and the match is a tie. Well done boys, the last couple of games you have stepped up to the plate and played some great cricket, finishing the season on a high note. This weekend we come up against the fancied Concord Briars Black, who sit in second place and desperately need a win to make it into the grand final. This is an incentive to make things difficult for them and treat it as your own grand final. Good luck and enjoy your last game of the season."

On the cultural front, Mia Seisun represented Reddam House at the Lions "Youth Of the Year" competition, where she was required to participate in an interview with a panel last Sunday and a public speaking event on Tuesday evening. She was required to present a speech of five minutes' duration and respond to two impromptu questions (with no preparation at all).

Mia was declared the overall winner against very stiff competition, an incredible achievement. She has been invited to the regional finals on 14th March.



Monday night was the opening of Art Express at the Armory Gallery, Sydney Olympic Park. It was wonderful to be there to celebrate with our 2020 HSC students Rose Chachko and Alexei Machkevich whose works were selected to hand in this exhibition.



Our Year 11 students visited the Art Express Exhibition at the Art Gallery of NSW. They have come back inspired to create and make even more of their sculptures on which they are currently working.



Twenty-three of our Year 9 and Year 10 music students will be flying to Adelaide today to attend the WOMAD-elaide Music Festival. The event has been in the calendar for some time but with the border closures, it's been a rocky road getting it to this stage - we're all very happy to see it go ahead. The persistence of Iain Tallis and Courtney Wood has paid off. My thanks to them.

Our Debating Teams opening debates against Cranbrook saw all our teams, except the Year 7 team, winning their arguments. The Year 10, 11, and 12 topic "that we should make individual police commanders criminally liable for instances of police brutality committed by their subordinates" created lively debate as did the Year 8 and 9 topic "that non-violent offenders should never be sent to prison". Congratulations to Mr Wallace, our coaches and the students involved.



The Year 10 drama students took part in a highly enjoyable puppetry workshop facilitated by International Puppet Maker and Puppeteer Kay Yasagi. They learned how to make an assortment of puppets and how to operate them. These skills will greatly help them when creating their Children's Theatre performances which they will perform in two weeks' time to Year 1 students from the Primary School.

You will receive further information in the coming months reading the process. You should receive a 4 digit pin via email from UAC (Universities Admission Centre) to enable you to apply within the next month.

YEAR 12:

A reminder that direct applications to ANU open 3 March 2021.

Due to the disruptions caused by COVID-19, we have adapted our admissions process for undergraduate study at ANU in 2022.

We will make offers based on Year 11 results on 9 August 2021, and these will be honoured for study in 2022 as long as students have completed Year 12 with an ATAR.

APPLICATION TIMELINE:

- ANU Applications are open 3 March – 24 May. Students can start their application at any time and log back in as needed to complete the process: <https://www.apply-asa.anu.edu.au/anu/>
- Students need to include their co-curricular activities with appropriate documentation: <https://www.anu.edu.au/study/apply/domestic-applications-anu-undergraduate/applying-to-anu-application-details/co>

- NSW HSC students do not need to include their reports in their application – the ANU will access their results directly for NESA (same as previous years)

- Tuckwell Scholarship Stage 1 applications are open 3 March – 18 April: <https://tuckwell.anu.edu.au/apply>

- complete and submit the ANU Direct Application as soon as possible and before 14 April 2021 (11.59PM AEDT); AND THEN

- complete and submit the Tuckwell Scholarship Stage 1 Application Form as soon as possible and before 18 April 2021 (11.59PM AEDT).

- The ANU Direct Application will ask if students wish to apply for a Tuckwell Scholarship – answer “yes” if you wish to apply.

- Within one business day of submitting the ANU Direct Application, students will be invited to the Tuckwell Scholarship Stage 1 Application Form via email. The sooner you submit your ANU Direct Application, the sooner you can access the Tuckwell Scholarship Stage 1 Application Form.




