Dear Parents and Caregivers,

This week as we reach the middle of the term and a week away from the official start of winter, we have experienced an out-of-the-ordinary run of cold May nights and days not felt since 1967. Ms. Dignan (our Geography teacher) explained the weather system that was responsible for this as "a ridge of high-pressure overhead that has been stable for such a long time and it hasn't had any other movement of air to displace it." With this cold weather, students are reminded that the Uniform Shop has warm hoodies, jumpers, beanies, and other warm accessories available so there is no need for students to "rug up" with nonuniform items of clothing.

The NAPLAN assessments were concluded this week much to the relief of the Year 7 and Year 9 students.

The third of four Parent/Teacher/Student interviews occurred on Wednesday evening with the last of these to happen next week on Wednesday 26th May.

This Friday many of our students are participating in the REACH assessment which is a preliminary assessment giving students entry into both Maths and Science Olympiads. Year 8 and Year 9 wrote Maths today, while the Year 10 students wrote Science. Year 7s wrote their Maths last Friday. While these are not every student's "cup of tea", many enjoy testing their knowledge in these areas and qualifying to progress to more demanding levels of competition.

Ruby Lewis-Millar, who had the lead role in the Year 11 play 'Pronoun', delivered her monologue at both Middle School and High School assemblies today. The gist of her speech was that 'tolerance of people who are different from us is not enough and that acceptance, celebration and being valued for who and what we are should be the norm'. In the play, she portrays Dean who is transitioning to becoming a boy and the conflicts that arise at school both socially, emotionally, and logistically.



This fitted in perfectly with the LGBTIQ society, which hosted the assembly, introducing a fundraising drive during June, being Pride Month. The profits of their drive will be donated to Twenty10, an organization that supports LGBTIQ youth with housing, mental health, counseling and social support. These youth are often from communities that are not as accepting of differences as ours at Reddam.

Our boys did extremely well with Dyllan Garratt, Flynn Botella, and Grant Stein being selected in the AICES Team. Brooklyn Berry has been selected as a shadow player. Congratulations boys.




