Dear Parents and Caregivers,

This week has been another busy week for our students before they settle into Half Yearly Examinations, which start on 11th June for all students, except Year 12 students who start on 17th June. By now I would imagine all students are well into their preparations for these, coordinating their studies around their busy schedules.

The Vocal competition was the culmination of a process whereby at least one hundred students submitted online recordings of their vocal performances. These were adjudicated, feedback given, and finalists selected, who performed their pieces live in Adelaide Hall on Wednesday evening. The adjudicator on the evening, Dr Rowena Cowley from the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, was left speechless by the talent on display and found it exceptionally difficult to separate performers from each other. On Tuesday, forty-six Year 11 students journeyed to Longneck Lagoon in Scheyville National Park to learn how to conduct a field study of an ecosystem. Despite an air temperature of 8°C on arrival, students cheerily collected qualitative and quantitative observations. They drew a transect of the forest and measured such things as canopy density, light intensity, soil pH and humidity at different points. They also tested the nearby waterway for such factors as pH, dissolved oxygen and turbidity. Of great interest to all was the dipnetting activity where we tried to scoop out tiny living things in the waterway. We were able to find caddisfly larvae, dragonfly nymphs, tadpoles and a shrimp!

From all the data collected, students will be preparing a Depth Study to explore why microbats, which inhabit Longneck Lagoon, are on the decline.











On the Sports Fields, we have come to that time in the season where "Representative Teams" are being selected in the various sports. Congratulations to our students who competed for CDSSA at the AICES Championships and to those selected to now represent AICES at the NSWCIS Championships.

In Touch Football 16 of our students went to Penrith representing CDSSA at the AICES Championships. Harison Walker, Liam McMaster, Sebastian Canturi, and Tommy Malki all played in the U15 Boys Team who finished 4th on the day Congratulations to Sebastian Canturi for being named as a shadow player for the U15 Boys Team to play at the NSWCIS Championships.

Lily Cyron, Maya Harris, Emma Rosenberg, Diana Van Geuns, Savanah Charles, and Willow Robinson all played in the 15s Girls who finished 3rd in the Championships. Tali Shapiro, Aaliyah Ibrahim, Zoe Kertesz, Odette Neil all played in the Open Girls and finished runners-up in the Championships.

The stars of the day were the Open Boys who won the Championships with Janine Hinds as the coach and Harper Mulligan and Jayden Reynolds in the team. Jayden was rewarded with selection in the AICES Opens Boys team to play at the NSWCIS Championships.



In Cross Country, thirty-five Reddam students travelled to The Sydney Equestrian Centre to compete in the AICES Cross Country Championships. Representing CDSSA our students gave their very best and ran their hearts out. Eight of our team were rewarded with a position in the AICES Team to compete at the NSWCIS Cross Country Championships. They empathised with her at the moment and did what had to be done. It was a really nice moment. We had a wonderful time."
