Dear Parents and Caregivers,

This week has seen all students focused on their Half-Yearly Examinations. Both campuses have been quiet as students single-mindedly get on with their own preparations for these assessments. Year 10 and Year 11 will continue until the last day of term next Friday. Year 12 continues into the holiday period for another week completing their exams on 2nd June.

Year 7, 8 and 9 students complete their exams today and will follow their normal timetable next week, finishing school at 3:30 pm each day. They go into the very important phase of this assessment period which is receiving feedback from their teachers. My challenge to all Middle School students is to take this process as seriously as they did their preparations for the exams. They should be able to completely understand the areas where they were marked down in the exams and should they receive the exact same paper by the end of next week, they should aim to be able to get 100% having rectified their mistakes. It is this growth mindset that will see students on a continual trajectory of self improvement.

The Eastern Suburbs got a COVID scare this week with a timely reminder to all of us that the virus has not disappeared and that precautions still need to be taken in the form of regular hand sanitising, getting tested if showing the slightest symptoms and not coming to school while ill. So far it looks like the cluster is a small one that has affected very few people in our school community. Those who were at any of the NSW Health listed "hotspot" venues have been tested with negative results.

The Queen's Birthday weekend was a welcome opportunity for most of our students to get prepared for this week's exams but for some, this weekend was the culmination of their winter season of sport with many of the NSW Championships taking place.

Congratulations to the following students on their achievements over the weekend and in this last week:

Grant Stein, playing for Randwick, won the NSW Rugby State Championship vs Warringah Rats in the final. It was a very tough weekend, with 11 teams competing this year. Good result Grant, well done.



The Australian Fencing Circuit #2 Competition took place in Adelaide where Joseph Glasson obtained a bronze medal in the Senior Men's Foil category.



Sophia Glasson also won her first senior women's medal in the Senior Women's Foil category. For Sophia, being only 13, to win a bronze medal in the Senior Women's Foil at a National AFC 2 is an incredible achievement. Congratulations to the Glasson siblings.
