Apart from not being able to get away as I had planned to do, Sydney is a wonderful place to be in lockdown, once the frustration of being in lockdown passes and acceptance kicks in.

I spent time doing all of the above. I read some amazing books, one of which I would like to share with you and strongly suggest that it gets onto your to-read list, and certainly that of your children. The Resilience Project by Hugh van Cuylenburg was suggested to me by a Reddam parent and reading it was one of the highlights of my holiday.



The announcement that Brisbane has been awarded the 2032 Olympic Games was a ray of positivity this week. Speaking of the Olympics, the Tokyo Games officially start today.

One of our sporting stars from the Reddam House HSC Class of 2020, Tia Hinds, is in Tokyo representing Australia as a member of the Women's 7s Rugby Team.

Tia had been at Reddam House since Year 4 and always excelled in sport. She was selected into the NSWCIS Open Primary Girls Touch Football Team in Year 4 and played in that team for three years.



Moving into High School, she was selected into the NSWCIS Under 15 Team in Year 7 and remained in that team until she was in Year 9. She then went on to make the Open Team and stayed in that until Year 11. (the team was not selected in Year 12 as COVID struck). Along the way, she represented the Roosters and Rebels in Touch Football and was very well known and respected in this sport.

In Year 9, she trialled for the NSWCIS Women's AFL Team and was selected. She went onto make the NSW All Schools Team and was later named in the Australian Team after winning the "best on-field" in the match against Victoria played in Perth.

While all of this was taking place, she also joined our Reddam rugby team, playing with the boys. In Primary School she played in the Peninsula Cup and then went onto Years 7 and 8 playing for Reddam against the Independent Boys Schools. Tia was outstanding in those matches and had a passion for rugby.

At this stage, she began playing Club rugby for The Magic at Randwick. She toured the world with her club Team winning many tournaments.

From Year 9 onwards, she played for the NSW Under 18 Team and then went on to make the Australian Under 18 Team who defeated New Zealand while Tia was in Year 11.



Having signed with the UTS Open Women's Team, Tia began to get a great deal of experience playing 1st Grade against the best players in Australia. 7's rugby took off here with our Women's Team winning the gold medal at the last Olympics when they played in Rio.

Tia secured a contract with the ARU in 2020 and has never looked back. Rated in the top 30 players in Australia at the time, she has been fast-tracked into the top 12 players and made the Team to play at the Olympics.

Tia is making the most of her opportunities and is a true inspiration and a great example of an individual who set herself high but attainable goals and worked extremely hard to achieve them. We wish her every success. I'm sure that the Reddam community will get behind Tia and her teammates.

Tia graduated from Reddam last year and was accepted to The University of Wollongong to study PDHPE. We are extremely proud of her.


